The GCSE consists of 3 papers, covering 4 different topics:

- Paper 1 Medicine through time (1250-Present), with a case study section on WWI trenches (1914-1918).
- Paper 2 Superpowers and the Cold War (1941-1991) and Anglo-Saxon and Norman England (1060-1088).
- Paper 3 Weimar and Nazi Germany (1918-1939).

- Be willing to write an answer for every question, and be prepared to write the required amount for the longer answer questions.
- Follow sentence structures and respond to feedback on extended writing.
- Engage in lessons being willing to actively take part in discussions and group work.
- Revise content as you go (from the start of year 10) and not only for mocks or the public exams.
- Take opportunities to build upon knowledge further.
